

Cultivation Facility Inspection

- CCB or designee shall conduct annual registration inspections, which may or may not be at random, to ensure compliance with Rules
 - Inspection requirements and protocols to be define through policy
- May inspect a license cannabis product or hemp-infused product during processing or storage.
- Inspection may include collecting samples, taking photographs and/or video, talking to registrants and/or witnesses, and/or inspecting records.
- Inspection may also include inspecting equipment and/or vehicles used for growing, processing or transporting cannabis, cannabis products, and/or cannabis infused products, and taking any other reasonable measure to evaluate compliance with these Rules.
- May inspect samples at retail establishments
- May use any cannabis crop samples to conduct genetic testing and/or research the potential of taxonomic determinations of cannabis cultivars or varieties grown.

Renewal

- CCB will send notice for license renewal at least 120 days prior to the expiration of a license
- Renewal applications submitted up to 90 days prior to the expiration of the cannabis establishment's license (required by 7 VSA 974 (a)(2)(M))
 - May apply for the renewal not less than 30 days prior to the license's expiration date
 - Provides for administrative review of renewal before expiration
 - If does file renewal within the 30 days prior to expiration, must provide written explanation detailing circumstances surrounding the untimely filing
 - If CCB accepts application, may administratively continue the license beyond the expiration date while the renewal licensing process is completed
 - If filing is timely and hasn't heard back from CCB and license does expire, the license will continue beyond expiration date until otherwise indicated or notified by the CCB of an incomplete renewal application or a granted license renewal.

Renewal

- An application for renewal will only be accepted if it is accompanied by:
 - Requisite licensing fee
 - Relevant Efficiency and Water Benchmarks
 - Applicator reports (where applicable for a specific license) per cultivation plan requirements
 - Changes/adjustments to outdoor cultivation site, if any, through diagram and GIS coordinate information
 - Disclosure of any relevant changes to direct and/or indirect financial interests
 - In good standing with CCB Enforcement or designee and other applicable state agencies where good standing is defined as:
 - No final order signed by a Secretary of jurisdiction
 - No court order signed by a judge
