Guidance Updates

Packaging MaterialsGuidance

Legislative update: H.270

- •As passed version has not been created by House Clerk's office as of 5/22/23.
- •That means the bill has not yet been sent to the Governor's desk for signature.

H.270: potential adult-use changes

- •Increases the THC per package limit to 100 mg.
- •Amends the definition of advertising to provide an objective standard for determining whether something is an advertisement.
- •Allows licensees to sell and transfer cannabis and cannabis products to other licensees. This removes some restrictions on transferring, such as manufactured products being transferred back to the cultivator.
- •Increases the cap on annual sales for Tier 1 Manufacturers to 50k.
- •Expands the requirements for CCB compliance records, so that if an investigation leads to an administrative action against a licensee, the case record becomes public. If not, a summary of the complaint and CCB action shall be public.
- •Removes the overlapping jurisdiction of DLL to license and inspect CE retailers selling paraphernalia but not tobacco products.

H.270: potential adult-use program changes

- Expands the limited set of agricultural benefits currently afforded to small outdoor cultivators to all tiers of outdoor cultivation.
 - Outdoor cultivation canopy is eligible for enrollment in Use Value Appraisal program if all other program eligibility criteria requirements are met
 - Agricultural inputs used for outdoor cannabis cultivation are exempt from the sales tax
 - Local regulation of outdoor cultivation cannot be more restrictive than it is allowed to be for other agricultural activities
 - For purposes of Act 250 permitting, outdoor cultivators operating in compliance with sections of the Required Agricultural Practices (RAPs) shall be regulated as farming and not as development
- Affords the same protections from nuisance lawsuits to outdoor cultivation as to other agricultural activities. Cultivators must be operating in compliance with the applicable law and the RAPs.
- Provides that the CCB may issue a license to operate without local approval if the Board finds that the municipality is regulating in a manner that would have the effect of prohibiting the operation of a cannabis establishment.

H.270: potential new license type

<u>Propagation license</u>

- •Separate, stand-alone license type (a cultivator licensee could also carry a propagation license)
- •Allows for 3,500 sq ft of vegetative plant canopy; no flowering canopy allowed.
- •Propagator licensees may sell seeds to the public; may sell clones to other licensees.
- •\$500 license fee
- License available in summer '24

H.270: potential medical program changes

- Eliminates requirement that patients with a PTSD diagnosis receive counseling.
- Increases plant count limits for patients and caregivers to 6 mature and 12 immature.
- Eliminates requirement for caregivers to undergo fingerprint supported background check.
- For all qualifying conditions except chronic pain, reduces medical card renewal requirement from yearly to every 3 years.
- Allows the Board to create rules that will ensure the medical program has similar requirements for safety and education as the adult-use program.
- Allows a single caregiver to serve up to two patients at a time; allows CCB to appoint more than two to a minor patient on a case-by-case basis
- Tasks a stakeholder group with developing recommendations for expanding the list of qualifying conditions, identifying strains appropriate for qualifying conditions, dosing and treatment standards, and other improvements to the program.

average days from submission to approval



average days from submission to approval


Based on License Type

by status





New cannabis establishment license application submissions:


by license type




Canopy Capacity Change with Renewals





Retail locations: areas of density





 - 19 failed to meet 15% threshold for youth audience composition
 - 12 failed to include health warnings
 - 5 included prizes or giveaways of cannabis
 - 5 lacked sufficient information
 - 2 were considered appealing to children
 - 1 other



MEDICAL CANNABIS PROGRAM


Patient and caregiver numbers: 2009-2022
