August 30, 2023 Board Meeting Executive Director Report

Preliminary data on flood impact assessment reports

- 150 flood damage survey responses received as of 7/19/23.
- 10 licensees have reported being impacted by the flood:
 - 5 tier 1 cultivators
 - 2 tier 2 cultivators
 - 1 tier 2 manufacturer
 - 2 retailers
- Summary of damage
 - Cultivation impact too soon to tell for many.
 Most reported 50% 75% plant loss; of these, most are replanting fields or greenhouses.
 - Retail impact one needs to move operations; one lost a few days of sales due to road closures; no reported product loss.
 - Manufacturing impact 15k of equipment damage and temporary business closure; minimal product loss.
- Impacted licensees
 - 3 are economic empowerment licensees
 - 1 is a social equity licensee





ADULT USE PROGRAM Employee ID card Demographics : Race




Employee ID card Employment: Hourly/Annual

Employee ID Card - Employment




Employee ID card Demographics: Average Age





Principal/Controller Demographics - Gender




ADULT USE PROGRAM Principal/Cont roller Demographics : Race








ADULT USE PROGRAM Social Equity Demographics : Race issued license














Issued indoor cultivation licenses comparison as of 8/23/24









Canopy Capacity Change with Renewals








MEDICAL CANNABIS PROGRAM
